What is NCEA?

NCEA is the National Certificate in Educational Achievement.

NBHS offers courses where there are standards from Levels 1 to 4. Courses offered could have:

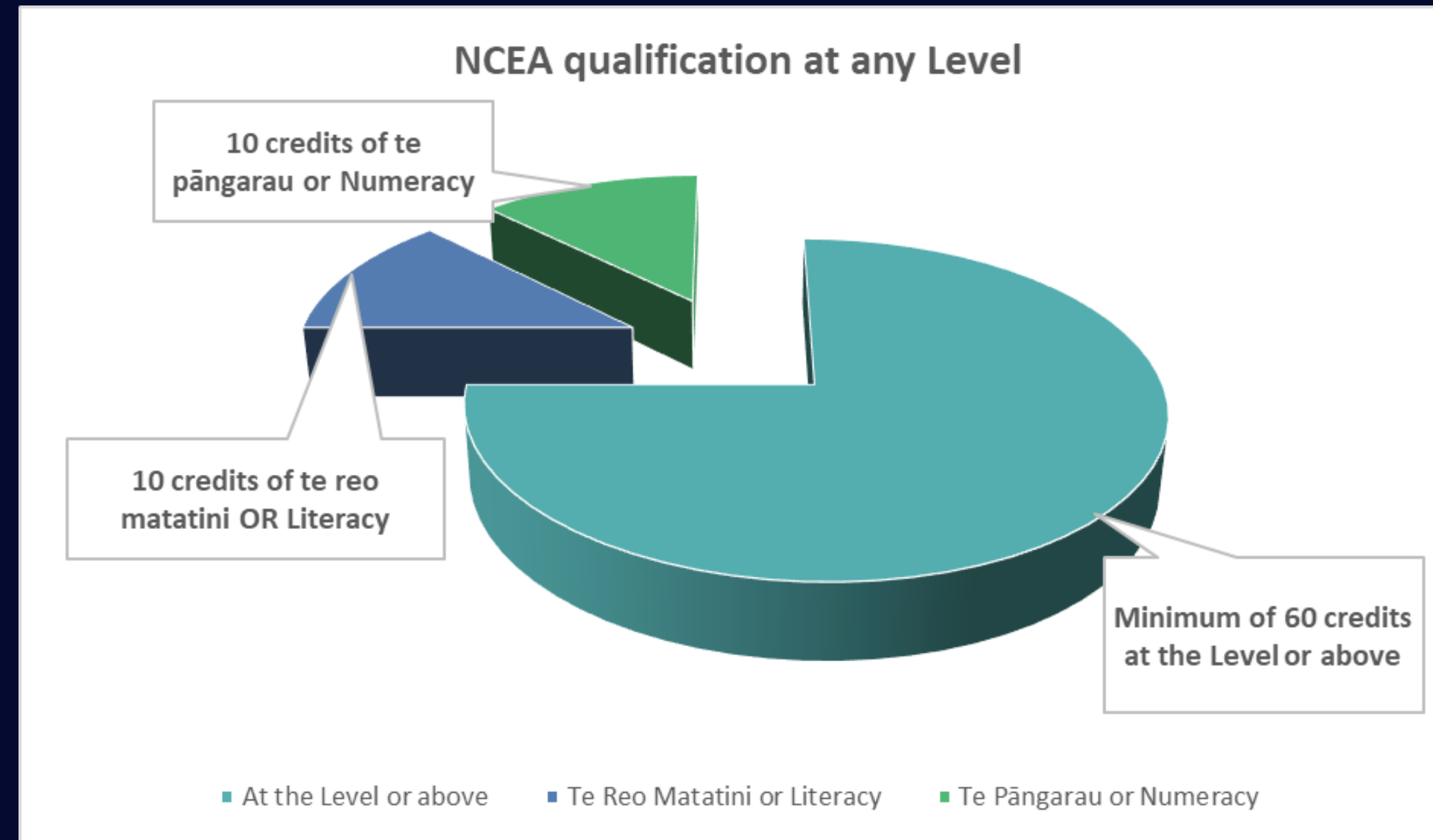
- Internally and/or Externally assessed standards
- Achievement and/or Unit standards
- Literacy or Numeracy tagged standards

Standards are allocated a certain number of credits depending on the weighting of work assigned to the standard. In the NCEA refresh, there are fewer standards, but they are worth more credits.

NCEA requirements

- Standards-based
- Assessment standards include
 - Achievement Standards: NZC/TMOA
 - Unit Standards: work-related skills
 - Skills Standards: work-related skills

- At each level, students must achieve at least 80 credits to gain an NCEA certificate.
- Credits can be gained over more than 1 year.
- The NCEA co-requisite is a required measure of competency in literacy and numeracy.



Monitoring your son's NCEA progress

- Kamar Portal – Up-to-date live reporting
- MyMahi – Uses Kamar data overnight to update progress
- MyNZQA Learner Account – is updated at the end of each month or after external examinations. These are the official results.

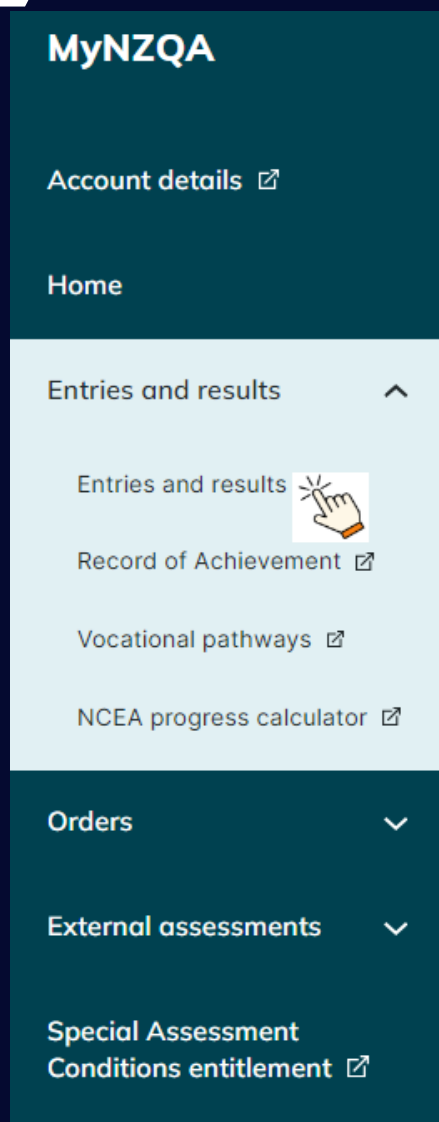

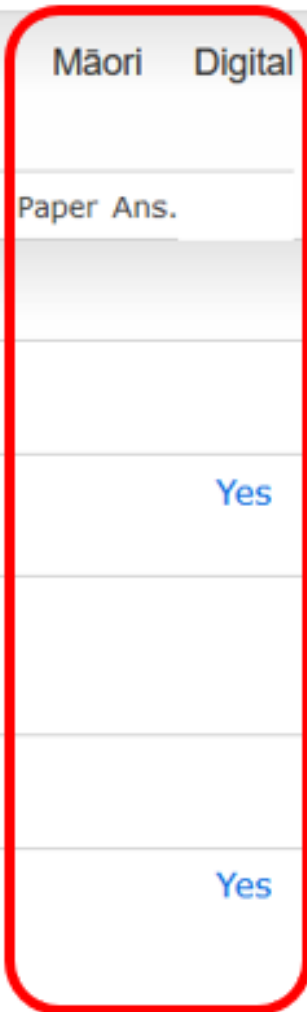

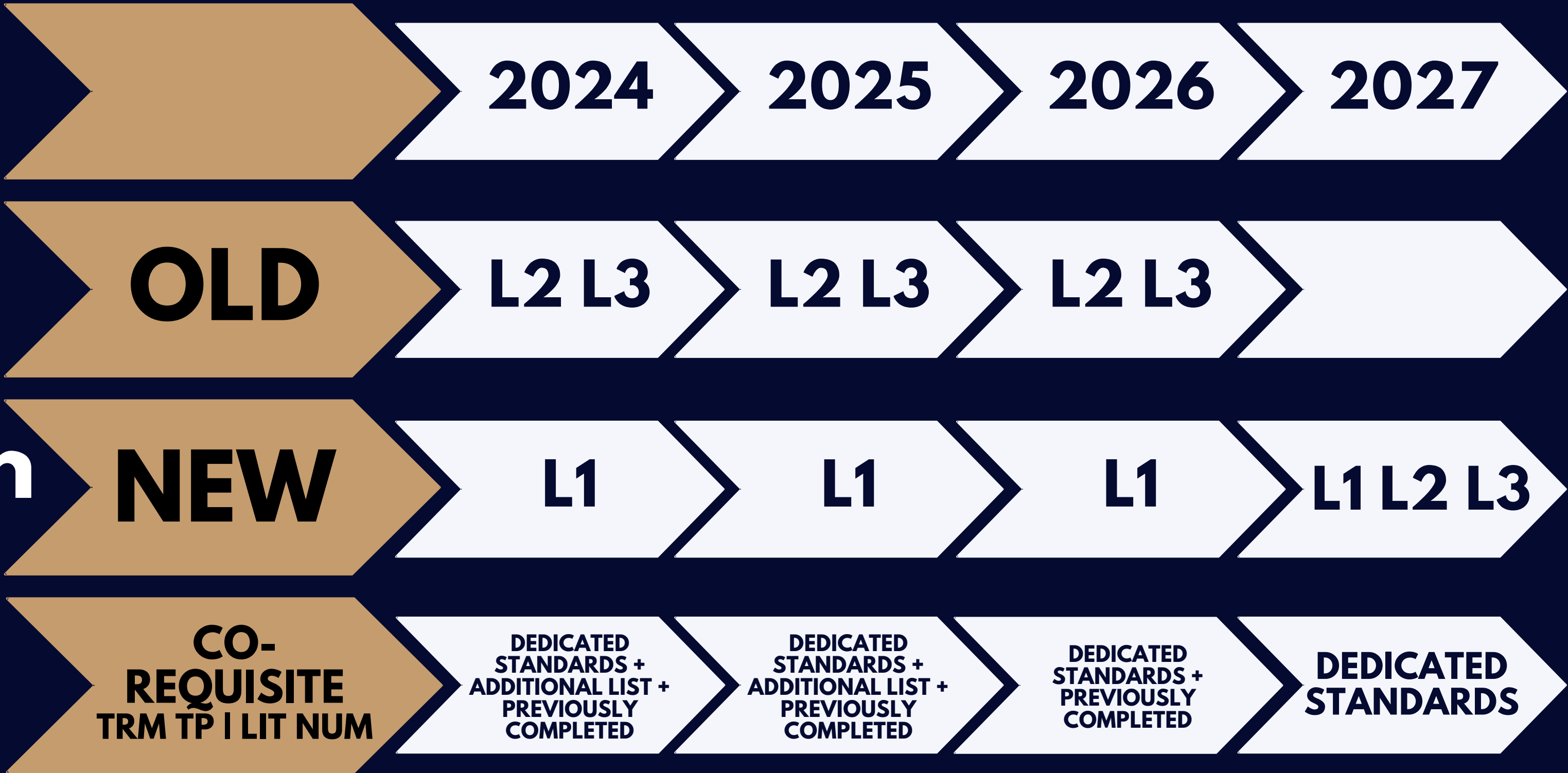


Check that your entry details are correct:

What is our school doing?

- We know that many schools have reconsidered their approach to Level 1 NCEA.

These are the changes we have made:

- Designing courses that allow teachers to assess all subject learning by offering all standards.
- Assessing students at Year 10 for their Numeracy and Literacy co-requisite
- Ensuring students who do not meet the Numeracy and/or Literacy standard in Year 10 are offered additional support in Year 11.

How the co-requisite works...

Gaining Endorsements

NCEA certificates can be endorsed with Merit or Excellence.

To achieve an Excellence endorsement, a student must earn 50 credits at Excellence. Those credits must be at the level of the certificate or above.

To achieve a Merit endorsement, a student must earn 50 credits at Merit (or Merit and Excellence)

Gaining Course Endorsements

Students achieve course endorsement if, in a single school year, they achieve:

14 or more credits at Achieved or Merit or Excellence, and at least 3 credits from externally assessed standards and 3 credits from internally assessed standards. (Excluding PE)

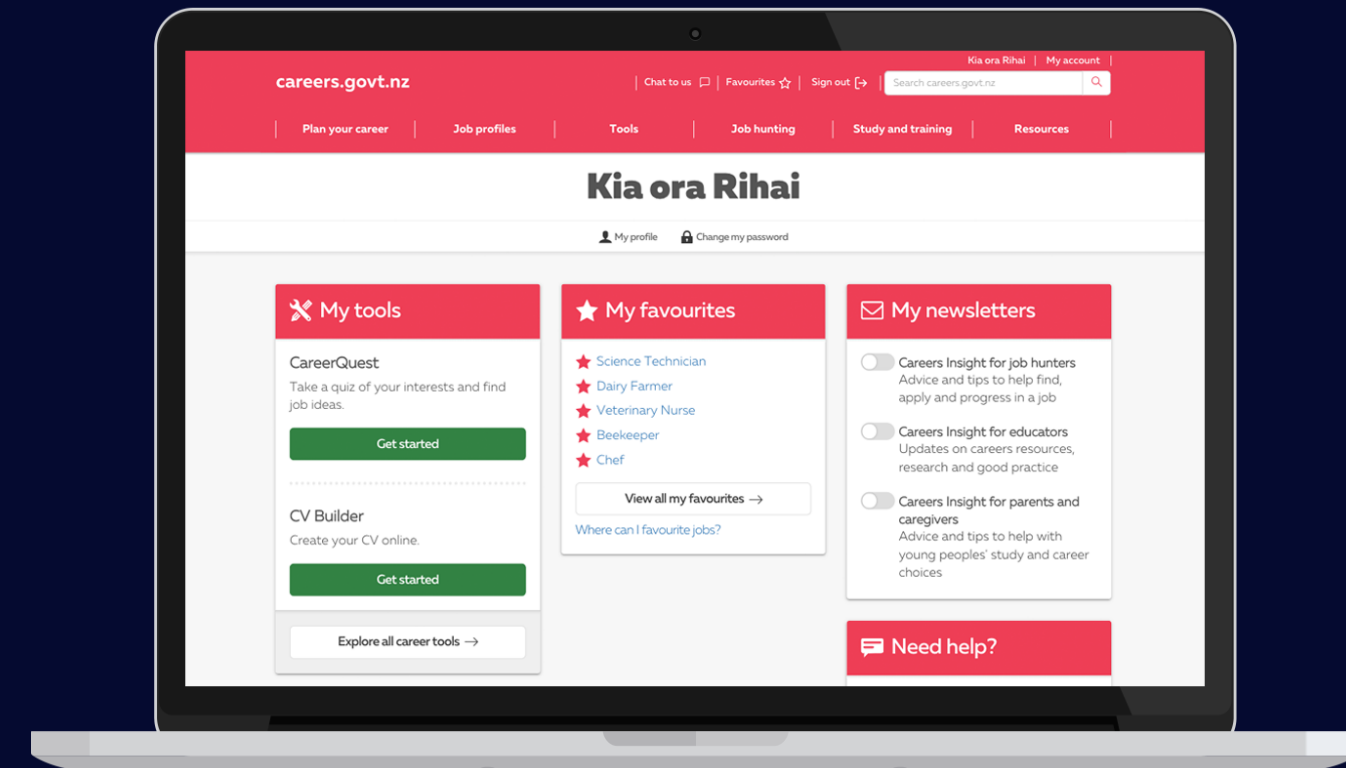


Subject selection and Course Planning
